BULBA OF BENIN



The Bulba of Benin, numbering 3,800, are Unengaged and Unreached. Less than 2% are evangelical, and there is no active CP activity. They are part of the Gur people cluster within the Sub-Saharan African affinity bloc. This people group is only found in Benin. Their primary language is Notre. The primary religion practiced by the Bulba is animism, a religious worldview that natural physical entities--including animals, plants, and even inanimate objects--possess a spiritual essence.
