The Aja (Ajagbe) have only been reported in South Sudan. They are part of the Sudanic people cluster within the Sub-Saharan African affinity bloc. Their primary language is Gbaya. The primary religion practiced by the Aja is Sunni Islam, the largest branch of Islam. Sunni Muslims follow the teachings of the Qur'an and consider the first four caliphs to be the rightful successors of Muhammad.

This people group's population is estimated to be extremely small. This people group may have assimilated into larger surrounding groups and may no longer be recognizable as a distinct group.
