Joseph Elikana testified “I was raised in a Christian home, but just followed through the motions of doing Christian things that I thought I was supposed to do. I didn’t know Him, I just knew about Him. I found myself searching for purpose and meaning of life. I also became very fixated on myself and my image. At my lowest point when I was alone and afraid, God drew me to Himself. From growing up in a Christian home, I knew what to do. I knew that He could save me if I just let Him. I confessed that I am a sinner and that I was trying to find life in other people and myself. I acknowledged that He sent Jesus to die on the cross so that I can be saved from my sins and have eternal life. I committed to living for God instead of others. He has given me fulfillment and purpose and joy. And when the things I was pursuing before continually let me down, God has never once left me. He has shown Himself to me in His Word, the Bible. God loved me even at my lowest point and He rescued me from myself and eternal separation from Him.”





We praise God that we managed to conduct training for some of our workers from different areas here in Tanzania. The training was done at Arusha. In Tanzania, we do this training every three months and we praise God that it was successful. BIANNUAL 2023 FACTS:

- The project has had a significant impact on the lives of **136** individuals. Christian fellowship has been established, leading to the regular Sunday Services and increased participation from both children and adults. As a result, the Gospel message is shared on a weekly basis, providing spiritual nourishment. Additionally, the children involved in the project receive essential provisions such as food, clothing, educational tours, and a designated space for sports activities.
- **130** people had the opportunity to hear the Gospel through ongoing outreach efforts.
- A total of **33** individuals experienced salvation.
- Furthermore, **4** individuals made a re-commitment to Jesus.

Tragically, Alvane's grandmother also passed away, likely due to food poisoning (the perpetrator remains unknown). Alvane himself experienced multiple instances of poisoning, but managed to survive. Losing both his mother and foster grandmother at such a young age, Alvane began to lose hope of finding someone to care for him.

Recognizing the immense hardships Alvane had endured, the Good Shepherd's House, part of the Tanzania Orphanage Project through NCM, was moved to extend a helping hand. Our goal was to restore Alvane's hope, happiness, and sense of security in order for him to dare to dream again. He is now a cherished member of the Good Shepherd's House family, surrounded by brothers and sisters who provide him with love and support. He radiates joy, finding delight in playtime with others and storytelling. Alvane's passion for sharing stories and making others laugh is contagious. When asked about his aspirations, he proudly proclaims, "Pastor Alvane!" Already taking his spiritual journey seriously, he engages in worship, prayer, and learning about Jesus. The Tanzania Orphanage Project through NCM embraces the responsibility to care for Alvane, ensuring he receives opportunities he could not have accessed before.



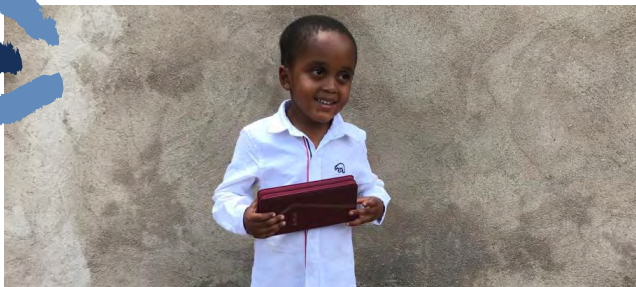
