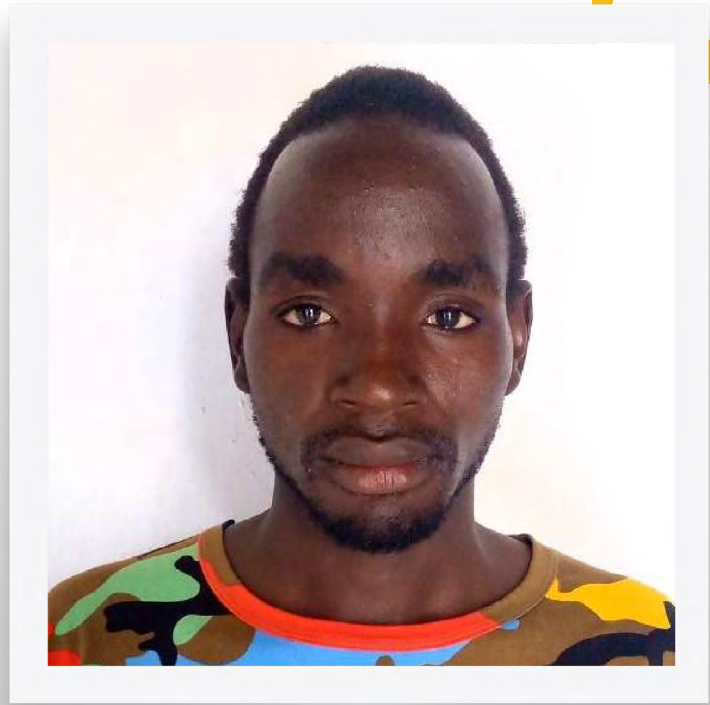

GBERI OF SOUTH SUDAN



The Gberi of South Sudan, numbering 1,800, are Unengaged and Unreached. Less than 2% are evangelical, and there is no active CP activity. They are part of the Sudanic people cluster within the Sub-Saharan African affinity bloc. This people group is only found in South Sudan. Their primary language is Mo'da. The primary religion practiced by the Gberi is Sunni Islam, the largest branch of Islam. Sunni Muslims follow the teachings of the Qur'an and consider the first four caliphs to be the rightful successors of Muhammad.
